A personal experience about learning ICTs in later life, by students from E-Seniors

I was born in Iowa USA on a farm and spent my life in the Midwest until after my masters degree (Iowa, Minnesota, Ohio and Michigan) After University I married a Palestinian and worked as foreign student advisor at Michigan State University until my husband received his PHD.

He took a position at IBM in Kingston New york where our two daughters were born.

When the girls were 6 and 9 we decided that their surroundings were too traditional for children of a bicultural marriage and he asked for a foreign assignment to broaden their horizon. We came to France where he worked on European telecom projects. We placed the girls at Marymount in Neuilly because it was the most cosmopolitan English speaking school in the Paris area.

We returned to the Hudson Valley in New York to the same home we had left. After seven years we both felt that it was time to try for another foreign assignment and ended up back in France where I have been ever since arriving in 1983.

In France, after receiving permission to work, I was offered the position of housing director of the American University of Paris which I accepted. After being fired for who knows what reason I decided to start my own business as an intermediary doing short term housing searches for foreigners coming to Paris. Upon reaching the age of 62, I took social security retirement from the US and terminated my business.

I was shamed into getting an email account. A friend simply walked me into an internet facility and opened an account for me. It took about ten minutes. Then she wrote me a couple of confirmation messages which I received and answered and I was hooked and hooked up. Having daughters in Seattle and Senegal at that point it was useful to communicate with them because of the time differences - 9 hours for Seattle!

I felt I should learn more so enrolled in an E seniors class in French but it went a bit too fast for me and tried to teach me how to do things that were not very interesting for me as a beginner. So I kept asking questions at the internet cafes and gradually figured out how to use google as it got more user friendly. By this time I had a mailing list of over 200 organizations, family and friends so said yes when my grand daughter in Indonesia asked me to join facebook. I never post messages but reply to those sent to me from others. I do word processing but do not know how to save and file for later correction and I should step up to this application soon. I hate spam and keep the machines out of my home so I can look at messages when I want to and not be stressed to consult email on my
